Manuscripts of a maximum of 10,000 words in length (including footnotes and a short bibliography) should be submitted as a Word document, along with a separate short abstract of no more than 250 words, up to a maximum of five key words, author contact details, and institutional affiliation, if any, to Dr. Jatinder Mann (Editor-in-chief) at acanzsjournal@gmail.com

Manuscripts should be formatted according to the Chicago Reference Style. Manuscripts should also be double spaced and use Arial font, size 12. All manuscripts

should be anonymised and will undergo double blind peer review, after an initial vetting by the journal editor.

JACANZS also has a book reviews section, which is edited by Dr. Jatinder Mann (University of Reading). Books that look at more than one country of focus of the journal will be prioritised, but books that look at just one country are also welcome. Reviews will be of 500-750 words in length. Authors and publishers interested in having their books reviewed and anyone interested in writing a book review should contact the book reviews editor at jacanzsbookreviews@gmail.com

JACANZS now also accepts reflective reviews. These are reviews in which the book lends itself to deeper contemplation in terms of historiography, contemporary politics, or the reflections on the life of the book reviewer themselves. These reviews can be 1000-1500 words in length.
